#### **Changes 1st April**

#### #Target100

Changes to the qualifying criteria for the sustainable development scheme 2021. (Target 100) Since 1st April 2018 UU has been encouraging Developers large and small to construct properties which promote a more sustainable use of water. Where qualifying developments can be proven to be constructed to use 110 litres per person per day, or less, we have provided a reduced rate against our Water Infrastructure Charge (as published in our charges scheme). We want to continue promoting sustainable living in the North-West; Therefore the target from 1/4/21 will be 100 litres per person per day.

#### Code for Adoption Water 1st April 2021

Please note as from the 1st April that all applications for selflay must have a valid point of connection as per the Code for Adoption - If you submit without a valid POC then this will cause a delay in your application.
