Trails

Torside circular route

Approx. 3.85 miles / 6.2km

Easy | **Intermediate** | Advanced
Estimated time allowance: 2 hours
Not suitable for wheelchairs, prams and bikes.

Longdendale Trail (Torside section)*

Approx. 2.48 miles / 4km either direction (east/west)

Easy | Intermediate | Advanced
Estimated time allowance: 1-2 hours
Suitable for wheelchairs and prams, with accessibility paths to viewing platforms, and regular rest points.
This is a traffic-free cycling route.
